Our OIA 2024/20: Verification of information about various COVID-19 payment schemes

Q3: Could you please proivde the exact day/month/year that the Wage Subsidy Integrity and Fraud Programme was established? We think it was in 2021.

Q4: Is our description of the initial Wage Subsidy scheme correct? Have we missed/misrepresented the scheme? Please see text.

Q6: In regard to Table A1.11, could you please clarify the end dates that the periods of the Ninth and Tenth RSPs applied for? The Excel found on IRD's website only has the starting dates of the periods.

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Q7: In regard to Table A1.11, we noted that in the Excel found on IRD's website, the sum of each individual RSP (1-10) is not equal to the grand total of all RSP periods (there is a difference of \sim 7,000 – see screenshot below). Could you please clarify where this difference comes from?

Q8: In regard to Table A1.12, could you please clarify if 'number of new businesses' is an accurate measure (i.e. would we be more correct to state the cumulative number of businesses loaned to between 2020–2023)?

Q9: In regard to Table A1.12, could you please provide the number of new businesses loaned to as at 30 Jun 2023? Alternatively, if your response to Question 4 was to change the measure, could you please provide this figure in the format that is recommended?

Q10: Could you please add any other information you would consider relevant to describe these schemes (e.g. CSP, RSP, SBCS) that we may have missed/is currently not included?

Q11: Was there any other COVID-19 payment schemes (other than those listed above)? If yes, please provide a detailed response.
