
MCGUINNESS INSTITUTE MEDIA RELEASE – 7 May 2019 2018 GDS Index launched – 148 government department strategies found and analysed

The McGuinness Institute is pleased to announce the launch of the 2018 GDS Index and the Institute's brand new publication *Government Department Strategies Handbook – He Puna Rautaki*. This concludes an extensive process of collecting, identifying, scoring, ranking and analysing all operational government department strategies (GDSs). A total of 148 GDSs were found to be in operation at 31 December 2018. The Institute has identified a total of 413 GDSs published since July 1994.



A launch event took place on Thursday 2 May, 2019. Institute Chief Executive Wendy McGuinness presented the key insights from the research to the audience, which included MPs, government department officials and other interested parties.

"The GDS Index NZ project," says McGuinness, "aims to illustrate how New Zealand might strengthen GDSs to make them more effective, responsive, measurable, comparable and durable through public consultation, engagement and ownership."

"The assumption is that if government departments work hard to make the content of GDSs more useful, users of these strategies will be able to assess their quality and, where appropriate, work with government to deliver better outcomes more quickly."

The top ranked GDS for the 2018 GDS Index is the Ministry for Primary Industries' (MPI) *Biosecurity* Science Strategy for New Zealand – Mahere Rautaki Putaiao Whakamaru. The 2018 GDS Index rates the extent to which essential information is provided in the strategy document, rather than rating the quality of the strategy itself. This is so readers can assess the quality of the strategic approach for themselves. Scores are based on the Scorecard the Institute developed with the help of strategy experts.

The 2018 GDS Index is the project's third update. The GDS Index NZ website now holds downloadable PDFs of 413 GDSs that have been in operation since July 1994.

The top ten ranked GDSs in the 2018 GDS Index are:

- 2 Rising to the Challenge The Mental Health and Addiction Service Development Plan (Ministry of Health) (published December 2012)
- 3 *Tau Mai Te Reo The Māori Language in Education Strategy* (Ministry of Education) (published June 2013)
- 4= Safer Journeys: Road Safety Strategy 2010–2020 (Ministry of Transport) (published July 2013)
- 4= *Ka Hikitia Accelerating Success: The Māori Education Strategy* (Ministry of Education) (published March 2010)
- 6 *Strategy to 2040 He Kai Kei Aku Ringa* (Ministry of Business, Innovation, and Employment) (published November 2012)
- 7 *Cultural Sector Strategic Framework* (Ministry of Culture and Heritage) (published August 2014)
- 8 Faiva Ora 2016–2021 National Pasifika Disability Plan (Ministry of Health) (published August 2017)
