- 1. What is the domain that is under consideration?

 Ocean Territory Protection Act 2012
- 2. How is the domain described within the Bill?

 The key distinction between the EEZ and the CS occurs in the definition of natural resources.
- 3. Prefer no regulations, in other words, it should all be contained in the Act. Second preference is that draft regulations should have accompanied the Bill. For example: The Hazardous Substances and New Organisms (Methodology) Order 1998 has been under review since 2002.
- **4.** Which organisation is responsible for New Zealand's sea strategy?
- **5.** Definition of effects is critical: Definition of effects should be included as per the Hazardous Substances and New Organisms Act 1996:

effect includes—

- (a) any potential or probable effect; and
- (b) any positive or adverse effect; and
- (c) any temporary or permanent effect; and
- (d) any past, present, or future effects; and
- (e) any acute or chronic effect; and
- (f) any cumulative effect which arises over time or in combination with other effects
