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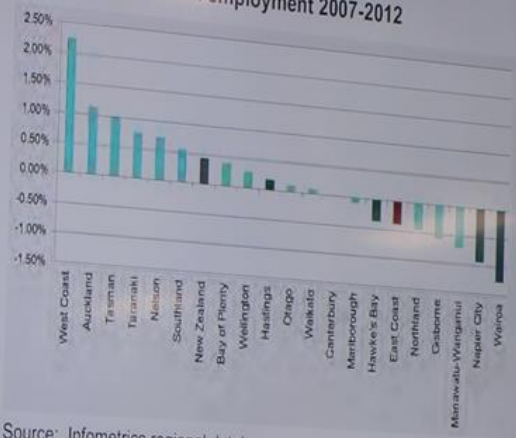


Poverty

- **Poverty** is a complex construct which is not just about the income a household has access to; it includes whether households have adequate resources that meets basic needs.
- **Poverty** is about **exclusion**.
- The Treasury's above emphasizes that living standards are enhanced if everyone has the **capability and opportunity to participate in society**. It is assumed that if people do not have these basic needs, then they do not have adequate capabilities and opportunities to participate.
