## An overview of think tanks based in New Zealand

Sustainable Future defines a think tank as an organisation, institute, corporation, council or group that conducts research and engages in advocacy in public policy. Think tanks derive income from a variety of sources, including commercial consulting and research, membership fees and private philanthropy. Although there is no single generic model or mission, for the purposes of this paper we have excluded government organisations that employ civil servants, such as Crown Research Institutes, and NGOs that do not employ researchers, such as Futures Thinking Aotearoa. We have included two university-based think tanks but are aware there may be more throughout the country.
